Sunday 21st April

Bedikat Chometz (search for chometz) after nightfall, from 8.56pm

Monday 22nd April - Erev Pesach

Ta'anit Bechorim (Fast of the Firstborn) 7.00am
Shacharit followed by Siyum for Ta'anit Bechorot¹ 10.36am
Hafsaka (time after which chometz must not be eaten) 11.00am
Communal chometz burning at WPS 11.48am
Biur Chometz - remaining chometz must be burned by 7.30pm
Mincha followed by Ma'ariv 7.54pm
Yom Tov begins and candles must be lit before 8.54pm
The Seder should not be started before

Tuesday 23rd April - First day of Pesach

Shacharit, including Tefilat Tal (Prayer for Dew) 9.30am
Mincha and Ma'ariv 7.30pm
Yom Tov candles lit from a pre-existing flame after 9.02pm
Preparations for Second Seder should not be started before 9.02pm
Begin counting of the Omer during the Second Seder

Wednesday 24th April - Second day of Pesach

Shacharit 9.30am
Mincha followed by Ma'ariv 7.30pm
Yom Tov ends 9.04pm

Thursday 25th April - Chol Hamoed

Shacharit 7.00am
Mincha and Ma'ariv 7.30pm

Friday 26th April - Chol Hamoed

Shacharit 7.00am
Mincha and Ma'ariv 7.30pm
Shabbat candles must be lit before 8.01pm

Shabbat 26th April – Shabbat Chol Hamoed

Shacharit including Shir HaShirim / Song of Songs 9.00am
Mincha and Ma'ariv 8.10pm
Shabbat ends 9.10pm

Sunday 28th April - Erev Yom Tov

Shacharit 8.30am
Mincha and Ma'ariv 7.30pm
Yom Tov candles must be lit before 8.04pm

Monday 29th April - Seventh day of Pesach

Shacharit 9.15am
Mincha and Ma'ariv 7.30pm
Yom Tov candles must be lit from a pre-existing flame but not until after 9.14pm

Tuesday 30th April - Eighth day of Pesach

Shacharit (including Yizkor) 9.15am
Mincha followed by a Shiur 8.15pm
Yom Tov ends and Ma'ariv begins 9.15pm
CHOMETZ SOLD MAY NOT BE EATEN UNTIL 9.45pm

Chag Kasher V'Sameach

¹ A Siyum is a completion of study of a tractate of Talmud. First-born males are obligated to fast the day before Pesach in commemoration of the miracle when they were saved from the plague of the firstborn. Attendance at a Siyum exempts firstborn males from fasting on this day, although they should be careful not to eat or drink until they attend the Siyum.
