Shabbat 26 <sup>th</sup> April – Shabbat Chol Hamoed Shacharit including Shir HaShirim / Song of Songs Mincha and Ma'ariv Shabbat ends	9.00am 8.10pm 9.10pm
Sunday 28 <sup>th</sup> April - Erev Yom Tov Shacharit Mincha and Ma'ariv Yom Tov candles must be lit before	8.30am 7.30pm 8.04pm
Monday 29 <sup>th</sup> April - Seventh day of Pesach Shacharit Mincha and Ma'ariv Yom Tov candles must be lit from a pre-existing flame but not until after	9.15am 7.30pm 9.14pm
Tuesday 30 <sup>th</sup> April - Eighth day of Pesach Shacharit (including Yizkor) Mincha followed by a Shiur Yom Tov ends and Ma'ariv begins CHOMETZ SOLD MAY NOT BE EATEN UNTIL	9.15am 8.15pm 9.15pm 9.45pm

<sup>1</sup> A Siyum is a completion of study of a tractate of Talmud. First-born males are obligated to fast the day before Pesach in commemoration of the miracle when they were saved from the plague of the firstborn. Attendance at a Siyum exempts firstborn males from fasting on this day, although they should be careful not to eat or drink until they attend the Siyum.
