Background

Daf Yomi, דף יומי, "page of the day" or "daily folio" is a daily regimen of learning the Oral Torah and its commentaries (also known as the Gemara), in which each of the 2,711 of the pages Babylonian Talmud is covered in sequence. A daf consists of both sides of the page. Under this regimen, the entire Talmud is

completed, one day at a time, in a cycle of seven and a half years.

Halakha

The brit milah בְּרִית, circumcision, מִילָה, circumcision, is performed by a mohel on the eighth day of a male infant's life.
